Recommended Ages: 4-12

Materials for the Bird Feeder:

- Cardboard tube (toilet paper roll)
- String
- Scissors
- Birdseed
- Peanut butter
- Bamboo skewer
- Butter knife

Cardboard Tube Bird Feeder:

This is a great quick after-school activity to do with the kids that will give you a chance to make some new feathered friends.

- First you are going to want to poke two holes in the top of the cardboard tube and two more towards the bottom.
- Thread a string through the top two hole.
- Then use the knife to spread peanut butter across the surface of the cardboard tube.
- Before the peanut butter dries roll the tube through the birdseed to cover the surface.
- Next, place the skewer through the bottom two holes so that the birds have a place for perching.

Place your DIY bird feeder outside near a window on a dry day and watch the friends that visit!

Tips To Keep The Day Alive: It is great that we have a special day to celebrate all that is the Earth, but we should do our best to keep that celebration alive once the day has come and gone!

- *Analyze your daily plastic use and see if you can replace one routinely used item with something reusable.
- *Get outside and plant something native to your area.
